- Learn variety of sleeve designs.
- Learn pattern techniques for styling bodices, blouses, shirts, dresses, princess seams, necklines, plackets and yoke designs, and collar designs.
- Learn how to choose correct interfacing for your sewing projects.
- Learn efficient sewing secrets that are used in the garment industry.

SEMINAR PROGRAM

MONDAY:

- Review pattern fitting process.
- Using your custom fitted B5300 pattern. Connie will check the fit of each person's B5300 pattern. After fitting, this pattern will be transferred to manila paper to be used as your custom sloper during the remainder of the week to develop your own custom designs.

TUESDAY THRU FRIDAY:

- Attendees are to bring a design of a blouse, vest, dress or jacket. This could be a photograph or a sketch.
- Connie will demonstrate how to make your own custom blouse, shirt, dress, jacket or vest by using this pattern. Depending upon the design, Connie will demonstrate flat pattern skills as well as draping skills. During the design process Connie will demonstrate:
- Connie will demonstrate many usages of darts and cups sizes, as well as creating various designs by using these darts as a design detail.
- Connie will also demonstrate how to use the custom sloper and redesign princess seams, various yokes, lapels, collars, and sleeves. Making these custom designs, may also include collars, sleeves, lapels or other design details.
- Each attendee will complete their pattern in class.
- Attendees will learn from the design of the other class participants.
- As time permits, possibly more than one design per person will be developed.
